Rear Admiral Frederick J. Brush graduated from the U. S. Naval Academy in 1931 and then served in USS COLORADO and USS PORTLAND before reporting for flight training at Pensacola where he earned his "wings" and became a naval aviator in 1936.

He then served in aviation units aboard carriers and the battleship PENNSYLVANIA and in 1942 was assigned to the staff of Commander Aircraft, Atlantic Fleet. He next served as Commander Air Group 81, based on USS WASP.

For heroic service during the period of December 1944 throughout the remainder of the war, Admiral Brush was awarded the Navy Cross, Silver Star Medal, Distinguished Flying Cross, Air Medal with two Gold Stars and is entitled to the Navy Unit Commendation Ribbon awarded USS COWPENS and USS WASP.

Admiral Brush served aboard COWPENS as Executive Officer and later became her commanding officer before assignments at shore stations in the United States and overseas. He graduated from the Naval War College in 1952 and then reported for duty as Assistant for Joint Chiefs of Staff and NATO Matters. In May 1954 he assumed command of USS POINT CRUZ (CVE-119) and, following a tour in the Office of Strategic Plans in the Office of the Chief of Naval Operations, took command of the aircraft carrier USS BON HOMME RICHARD until 1957 when he became Chief of Staff and Aide to Commander Carrier Division SEVEN.

He was advanced to the rank of Rear Admiral, February 1, 1960, while serving as Assistant Chief of Naval Personnel for Personnel Control.

This duty was followed by a tour as Commander Carrier Division SIX and in August 1962 Admiral Brush was assigned as Commander Fleet Air, Mediterranean, and Naval Activities, Mediterranean, with additional duty as U. S. Country Representative, Italy.

From June 1964 until April 1967 he served as Assistant Chief of Naval Operations (Logistics). On April 4, 1967, he assumed his present duties at Key West.

Rear Admiral Brush has also been awarded the American Defense Service Medal, American Campaign Medal, Asiatic-Pacific Campaign Medal with four operation stars, World War II Victory Medal, China Service Medal, National Defense Service Medal, and the Philippine Liberation Ribbon.
