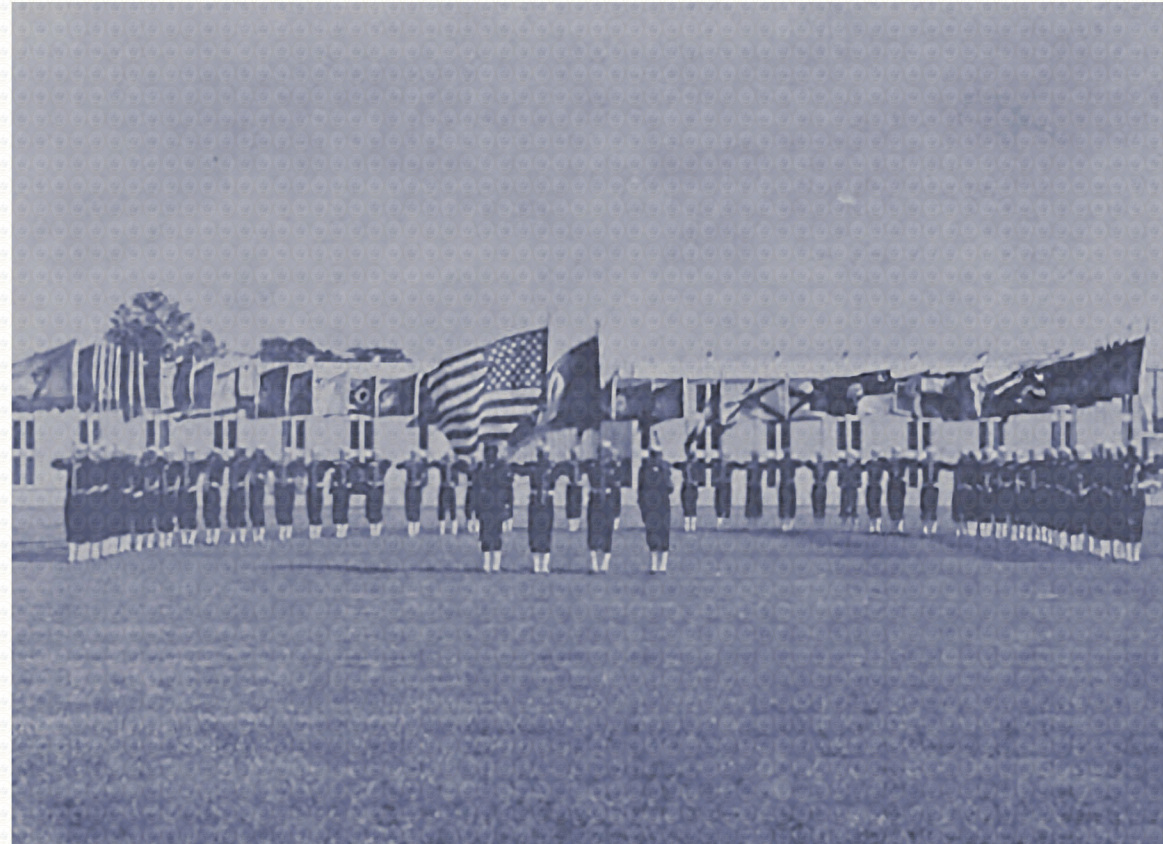

# REVIEWING OFFICER



Vice Admiral Arnold F. Schade  
United States Navy  
Commander Submarine Force,  
U. S. Atlantic Fleet

Vice Admiral Arnold F. Schade was graduated from the Naval Academy with a Bachelor of Science Degree and commissioned Ensign on June 1, 1933.

After graduating, he served two years aboard the cruiser USS CONCORD and in 1935 attended the Submarine School in New London, Connecticut. Following submarine school, he served aboard submarines R-10 and USS PERCH.

From August 1940 until the outbreak of World War II, he served aboard submarine R-12. He reported to USS GROWLER in February 1942 as Executive Officer and in February 1943 assumed command of GROWLER for the following 15 months. While on GROWLER he received the Navy Cross, Silver Star Medal, and Bronze Star Medal with Combat "V".

In July 1944 he assumed command of USS BUGARA and from February 1946 until May 1947 he served in Submarine Administrative Command, Mare Island, California, as Executive Officer and Operations Officer. He was Executive Officer of USS BUSHNELL for seven months and Operations Officer of Task Group 7.3 (Atomic Tests, Eniwetok) and Commander Submarine Division 12 for a year.

From August 1949 until February 1950, he attended the Armed Forces Staff College, after which he served until July 1952 on the Staff of Commander in Chief, Naval Forces Eastern Atlantic and Mediterranean. In September 1952, he assumed command of Submarine Group One, Pacific Reserve Fleet. He attended the National War College in 1954-55 and in June 1955 assumed command of USS SEMINOLE.

Vice Admiral Schade was on the staff of the National War College during the 1956-57 and 1957-58 terms after which he was designated Commander Submarine Squadron SIX. In August 1959, he was awarded a Fellowship at the Center for International Affairs, Harvard University, and in June 1960 became head of the Navy Plans Branch in the Office of the Chief of Naval Operations. In August 1961, he became Director of the Politico-Military Policy Division of that office. Two years later he was detached to command the Middle East Force. He received the Legion of Merit while in that command.

In August 1964, he reported as Deputy Commander in Chief, U. S. Naval Forces Europe and in February 1966 became Assistant Chief of Naval Operations (Plans and Policy). In November 1966, he was promoted to Vice Admiral and assumed command of the Atlantic Fleet Submarine Forces.

In addition to the other medals mentioned, Vice Admiral Schade also received the American Defense Service Medal, American Campaign Medal, Asiatic-Pacific Campaign Medal, World War II Victory Medal, Navy Occupation Medal (European Clasp) and the National Defense Service Medal.

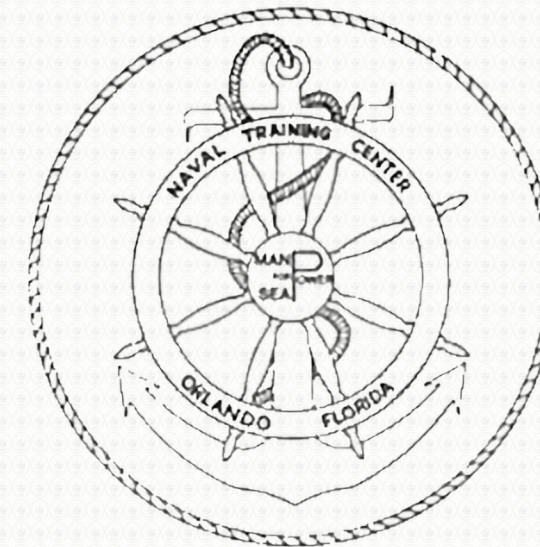
