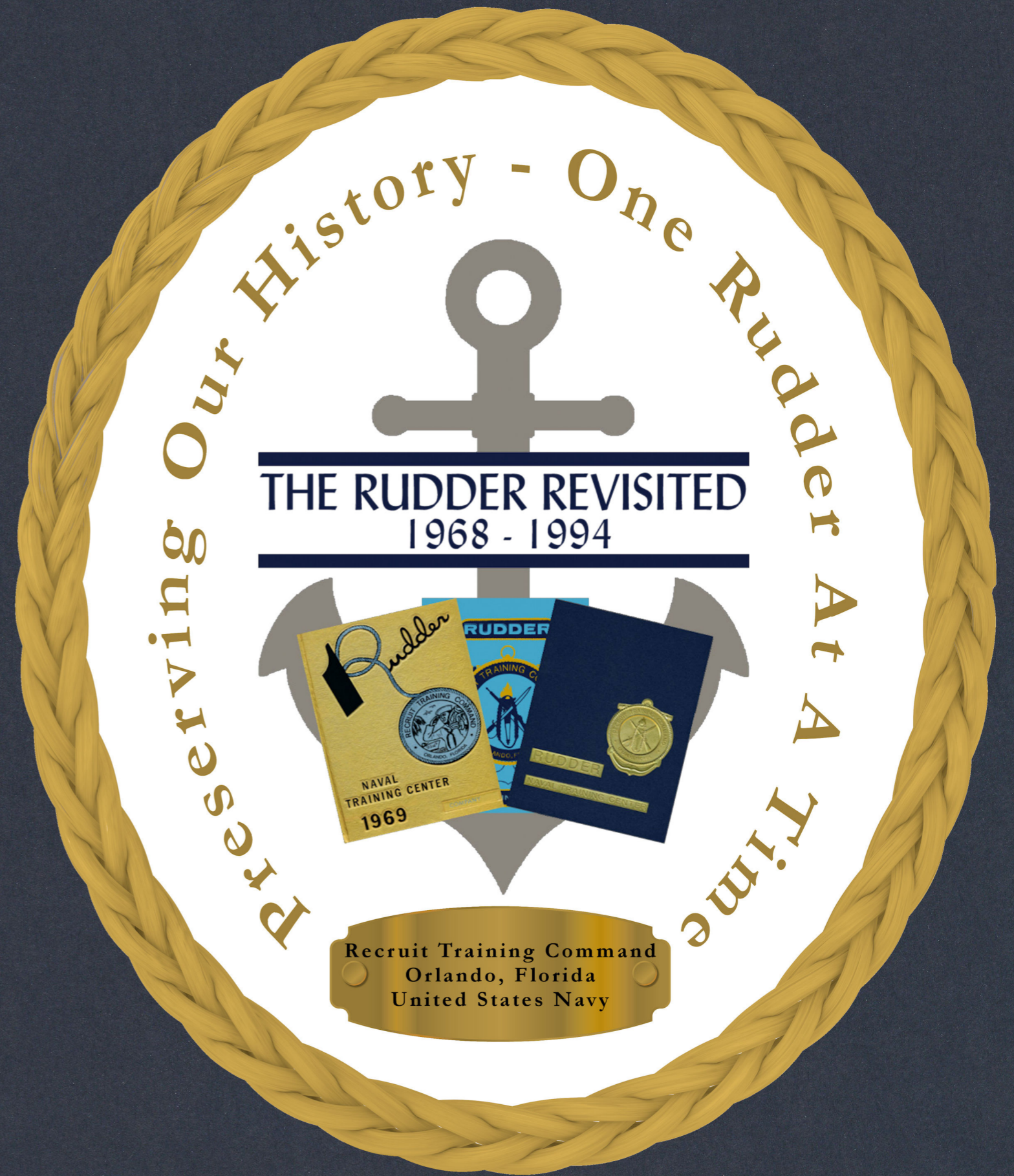

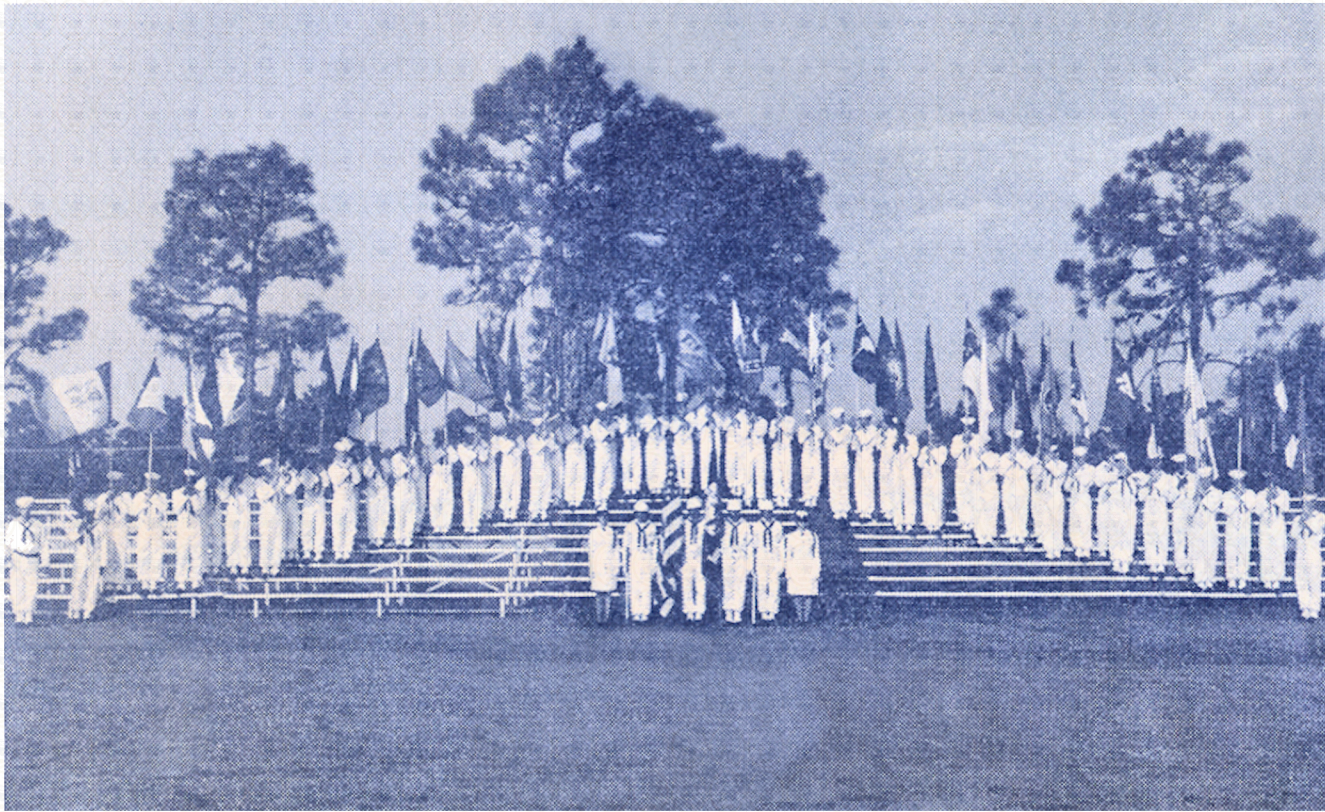

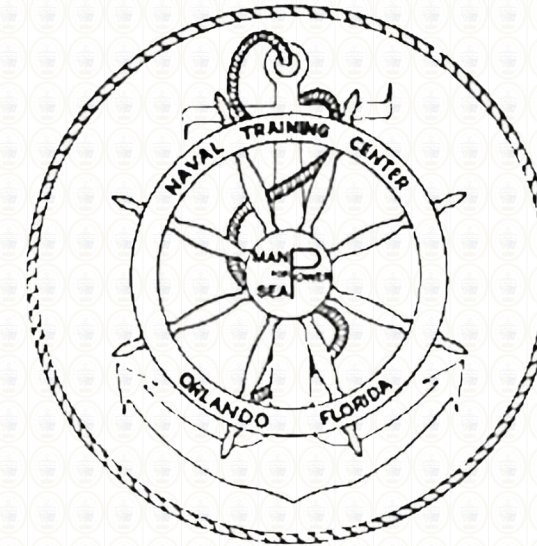

Rear Admiral Oscar Gray, Jr., a native of Little Rock, Arkansas, received his M.D. degree from the University of Arkansas School of Medicine in 1944. While in Medical School, he entered the Navy's V-12 program. Following graduation, he was assigned to the Portsmouth Naval Hospital, Portsmouth, Virginia, for intern training.

The Admiral was released from active duty at the end of World War II after having served at sea and in French Morocco. Until his return to active duty for the Korean Conflict, he had a partial residency in general surgery and established a small general hospital in Jacksonville, Arkansas, in conjunction with his private practice.

Upon his return to the service in 1953, Admiral Gray was designated a Flight Surgeon and served with Composite Squadron FOUR, Atlantic City, New Jersey. Since that time, he has served at the Naval Air Station, Pensacola; as Senior Medical Officer, of the aircraft carrier FRANKLIN D. ROOSEVELT; as Senior Medical Officer, Naval Air Station, Point Mugu, California; as Senior Medical Officer and Officer-in-Charge of the hospital, Naval Air Station, Lemoore, California; as Wing Medical Officer for the First Marine Air Wing in the Pacific; and at Naval Air Station, Jacksonville, Florida.

He assumed his present assignment as Commanding Officer of the Naval Aerospace Medical Center, Pensacola, in July 1970.

Admiral Gray is married to the former Betty Rogers of Little Rock, Arkansas, and they have four children.

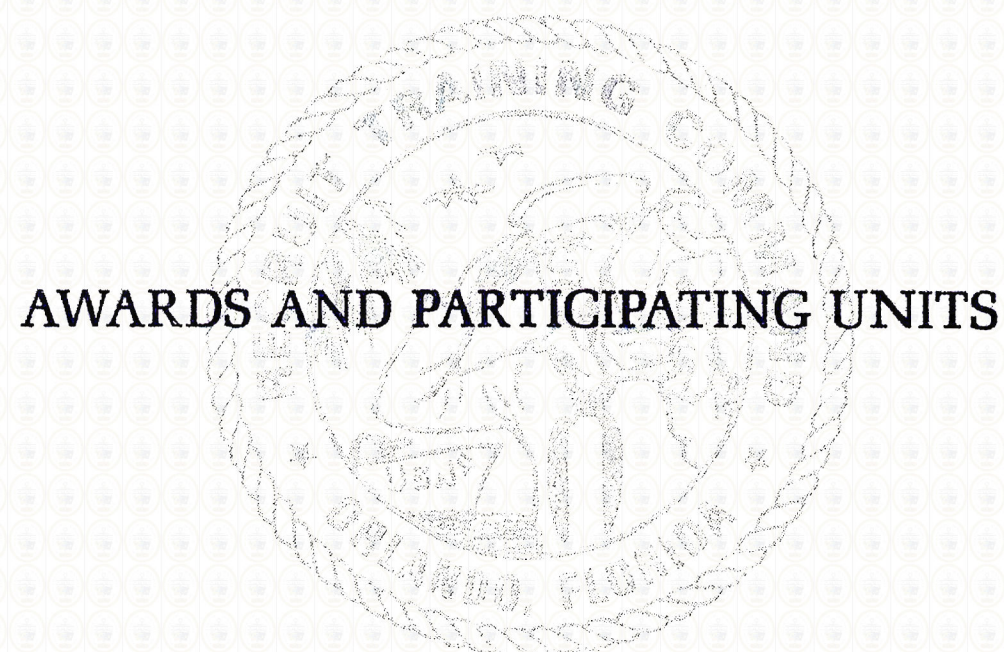

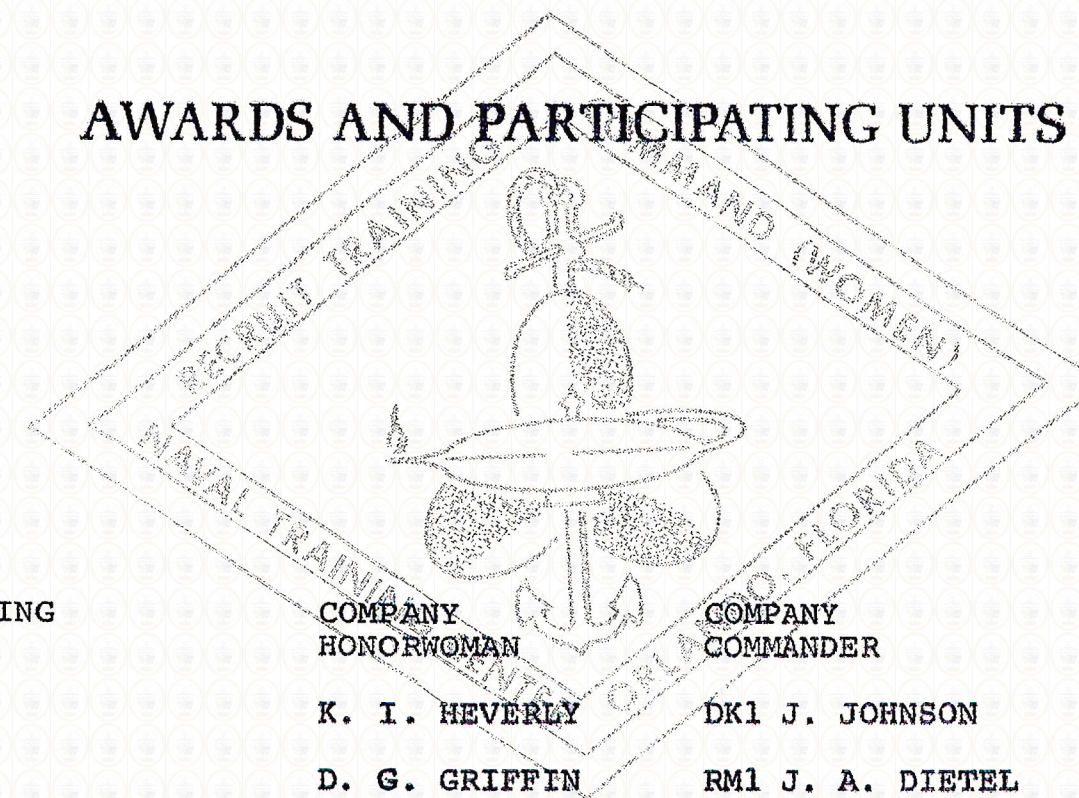
